The Lecture Series Enters A New Decade

The eleventh year of The Illumination Lecture Series kicked off last month, with Junior Grand Warden Ara Maloyan giving his talk on *Astronomy or Is It Astrology*? He is the first of an exciting list of speakers, some traveling from across the Country (South Carolina, Arkansas and Texas) to share their Masonic knowledge and insights with our lodge and guests. Their topics will range into Masonic Symbolism, Altruism, Civility, Philosophy, Self-Improvement and even Death.

Eleven years ago, a small group of SPML Brothers, in search of Masonic education, gathered around and simply shared their deep findings of Masonic ritual, symbolism, and philosophy. That soon grew into "talks" and later into a monthly lecture series that earned the name—*The Illumination Lectures*. Now the longest continuing lecture series in our State, the Illumination Lectures have hosted illuminating scholars from across the Country. Many of the most noteworthy Masonic Scholars alive today have graced our lodge halls and spoken in our lodge room, spreading their wisdom to all light seekers willing to listen.

This year, six of our eight speakers are first time presenters at our lecture series; and we have two Past Grand Masters and the current Junior Grand Warden in our roster; the most Grand Lodge representatives we've ever hosted in a single lecture year.

The highlight of the year will undoubtedly be the third Installment of SPML's Masonic Con (August 9th thru 11th), with a tentative visit by our present California Grand Master, Most Worshipful Sean Petroka, who will take part in the great Festive Board that will open our ceremonies, taking place on Friday, August 9th starting at 7pm. Our scheduled speakers will each share their own take on studies connected to Masonic education; and several will be visiting our lodge for the first time.

The Illumination Lecture Committee—Lodge Master Geno Nadirov, and Brothers Dago Rodriguez, PM; Jeriel Smith; Nathan Brown, Nate Bexton, Max Mironenko and Aaron Habibipour—have all been hard at work, seeking out the most unique and exciting Masonic speakers to visit our lodge and spread the light that they have researched to share with the brethren of 290 and surrounding lodges, and interested guests in the community.

Our Illumination Lecture nights will also continue on their traditional first Monday of most months (Dark in January, July, August, and September) at 7pm. Our First Lecture of The Year

The Lecture Committee Welcomes Junior Grand Warden Ara Maloyan

On February 4, two dozen hearty brother Masons and guests braved a proverbial "dark and stormy night" to be a part of the commencement of a second decade in the annals of the Illumination Lectures. Our guest speaker for this occasion was a truly distinguished Mason, well known locally—Right Worshipful Ara Maloyan—who, for this occasion, chose to respond to his own question: *Masonic Astronomy, or Is It Astrology?* He was introduced by Brother Nathan Bexton, who also reviewed the history of the first decade of the Illumination Lecture Series.

Last October, Wor. Maloyan, PM was elected Junior Grand Warden of California Freemasons. He was raised in 1999 at Hayastan Lodge No. 94, Washington, D.C., and a year later he affiliated with Santa Monica-Palisades No. 307, where he served as Lodge Master in 2005 and received its Hiram Award in 2015. His Grand Lodge website profile runs to 5 pages, including memberships in 15 Appendant Bodies. His education and professional experience are both of a scientific and technical nature. He graduated from California State L.A. with a degree in Civil and Structural Engineering, obtained his Civil Engineering License, and worked in a series of positions as City Engineer and/or Public Works Director for the cities of Los Angeles, Beverly Hills, Long Beach, and Pasadena; and is now the Director of Construction for a private real estate development company.

As his talk was tiled (Masons only), due to some direct references to Masonic Ritual, I will not attempt my usual summation of the contents here. Suffice it to say that much of it was technical, all of it interesting, and parts were very similar to the Astronomy class I took years ago as an undergraduate at UCLA. After noting that the modern science of astronomy is a descendant of the much earlier, but still extant, practice of Astrology. (Continue on page 12)

SPML'S A LOOK BACK LECTURE SERIES ILLUMINATION

Illumination Lecture December 4, 2023 Review by Jeriel Smith



The Illumination Lecture Committee Welcomes Bro. Charlie Fisher, PM

December 4, 2024 marked a momentous event in the history of South Pasadena Lodge 290, as our 10th Anniversary Illumination Lecture Series reached its conclusion—the same way that it had started back in 2013—with Wor. Brother Charlie Fisher, PM giving the lecture; on *Our Masonic Brother Mark Twain*. Twenty-five brothers and guests gathered in the Lodge Room for this event; compared to the four who were present at that inaugural lecture.

Dressed appropriately in Brother Twain's iconic white suit, Brother Charlie's presentation was delivered as the very person of the immortal author, speaker and humorist who became an iconic pioneer of American Literature. Just as appropriate, "Brother Twain" began his reminiscence by referencing the legendary coincidence that both his birth (Nov 30, 1835) and his death (April 21, 1910) were marked by Halley's Comet making its regular 76-year appearance in the heavens. In 1909, Twain famously remarked: "I came in with Halley's Comet. It is coming again next year. The Almighty has said, no doubt, 'Now there are these two unaccountable freaks; they came in together,



they must go out together." How singularly appropriate for Brother Charlie to choose this topic to celebrate the beginning and end of the first decade of our Illumination Series. Thus, he now takes his place as the "Halley's Comet" of South Pasadena 290's Masonic Education! [Worry not, my brothers, the Illumination Lecture Series itself will continue on. Perhaps it will still be going strong in 2061, when Halley's Comet will next become visible in our sky?]

Charlie's "Twain" continued with musings of his boyhood in Hannibal, MO; the death of his father when young Sam Clemens (his given name) was II years old; and his experiences as a Mississippi River Boat Captain. Navigating the Big River then was fraught with danger; Twain's own brother was killed in a boat explosion at age 20. His own riverboat career was short. Soon after having earned his Pilot's license, the onset of the Civil War began a long demise in civilian river travel. After a brief few weeks' service in the Confederate army, he headed next to the Nevada Territory, where gold and silver beckoned. Unfortunate at mining, but always a keen observer, he began writing for local newspapers. It was here, at a miner's camp in 1865, that his sense of humor and gift for irony brought forth their first bounty: The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County. Along with several "other sketches" it became his first book in 1867.

He recollected appropriating his pen name from that of a fellow riverboat captain, both being based on the practice of boatmen calling "mark twain" when their plumb line measured the river's critical depth at two fathoms. Following his travels to San Francisco, then Hawaii and back, Twain began his renown lecturing career with stories of his Hawaiian experiences. Space does not allow even a summary of the world travels that Twain shared next, many of which were humorously described in his *The Innocents Abroad* (1869). After his wife-to-be finally accepted Twain's third marriage proposal, they moved to Buffalo, NY where he penned *The Gilded Age* (1873). He then built his famous house in Connecticut, where their family (with 4 daughters) lived thereafter.

A type-setter himself, and always interested in new technology, Twain invested in and lost a fortune (\$300,000 then, equivalent to \$7 million today) on an unsuccessful attempt to perfect an automated type-setting machine. He traveled the world for years lecturing, during which time he began wearing his iconic white suit; he even received an honorary degree from Oxford. "Not bad for someone with a scanty education" quipped Brother Charlie's Twain. Later, Mark Twain also became a very successful publisher. He persuaded Ulysses S. Grant to write his Memoirs—finished mere days before the great general and president died-which was such a great literary success it rescued Twain's own financial future, and provided that of Grant's grieving widow.

"Read my books" the real Mark Twain once mused; "My life is an open book." Then he added: "Huck Finn wrote *that* book; I just edited it."

In closing, Brother Charlie's Twain briefly assessed author Twain's scant Masonic career. He petitioned Polar Star Lodge No. 79 in St. Louis, MO, in December 1860 and was raised in July, 1861. Suspended for non-payment of dues after he had left for Nevada Territory, he was later reinstated; but he then dropped out after 1869. Though there is little evidence of any Masonic activity in his extensive world travels, Freemasons today continue to take great pride in remembering him as their beloved Brother Mark Twain.

He explained how both concern the apparent arrangement of stars as seen from Earth, and their actual and perceived impacts on humanity and nature.

He shared many informative slides to illustrate and explain constellations & signs of the Zodiac, planetary orbits and alignments of the sun, moon and earth; latitude and longitude; the effects of earth's 23.5° tilted axis to its orbital path; solstices and equinoxes; holidays and festivals, etc. To that were added cogent connections with Freemasonry and references to our symbolism and ritual; salient of which being the Point-within-the-Circle & the Holy Saints John, concluding with a humorous image of a fried egg with a slice of bacon tangent to each side. There followed a robust Q&A and a discussion that continued into the Library at our traditional candle-lit dinner.
